

****RESEARCH ASSISTANT POSITION AT BROWN-AFFILIATED BUTLER HOSPITAL****

Butler Hospital's Psychosocial Research Program is hiring a full-time research assistant. The role will involve time on 3 projects, including a qualitative study interviewing patients with opioid use disorder, a clinical trial for a new suicide prevention intervention for adults with mental health disorders, and a suicide prevention intervention for youth with first episode psychosis. The role also includes additional research on transitions of care, suicide prevention, and digital health interventions. This is an in-person position.

Candidates should have a bachelor's degree in psychology, neuroscience, public health, or a related field by the position's start. This role is ideal for those aiming for graduate or medical school, with opportunities to publish and present at conferences. Previous research assistants with this lab have successfully gained acceptance into top doctoral programs after this position.
